ENGLISH	*Show and Tell Activity* In the Show and Tell activity, each child brings a special item from home, like a favorite toy or family photo, to share with the class. They take turns describing their

MATHS

Big And Small Activities with Everyday ObjectsBegin with everyday items around the house. Gather a collection of objects of varying sizes: a pencil, a crayon, a toy car, and maybe a stuffed animal. Ask the child to arrange them from the smallest to the biggest or vice versa.



Count and Match is a hands-on activity where children are tasked with counting a set of objects and matching them to the corresponding numbers or quantities.
