## English – Walk around on alphabet mat

In the "Walk Around on Alphabet Mat" activity, children in **pre-nursery** explore letter recognition and movement by walking, hopping, or dancing on a large mat featuring the alphabet. Each child is encouraged to step on different letters as they are called out by the teacher, helping them to associate the letter's shape and sound in a fun, interactive way. This activity not only aids in letter recognition but also develops **gross motor skills** and coordination. The playful environment fosters a positive and engaging learning experience for young children.



## English – Picture word matching

In the "Picture Word Matching" activity for prep class, children enhance their vocabulary by matching pictures to their corresponding alphabet. A set of cards with images and another set with words are provided. Children take turns selecting a picture card and finding the matching alphabet card. This activity encourages visual recognition, word association, and memory skills while making learning interactive and enjoyable. It also helps children improve their language skills and prepares them for more advanced in picture reading tasks.

## English:- Bingo Picture Fun

In the "Bingo Picture Fun" activity for prep class, children play an engaging game of bingo using cards filled with pictures instead of numbers. Each child receives a bingo card with various images, and the teacher calls out the names of the pictures randomly. Children mark the corresponding images on their cards using markers or chips. The first child to complete a row, column, or diagonal shouts "Bingo!" and wins the game. This activity helps with listening skills, picture recognition, and concentration, all while providing an exciting and interactive learning experience.

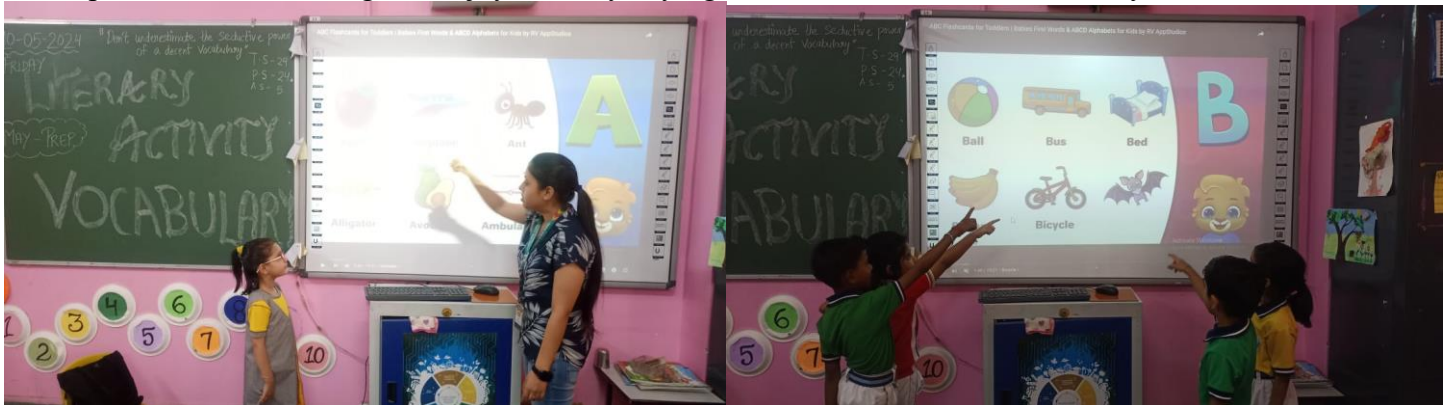
## Nursery- English- Flash Card reading

Children learn to read with these flash cards which is an engaging activity. It help students to learn new words.



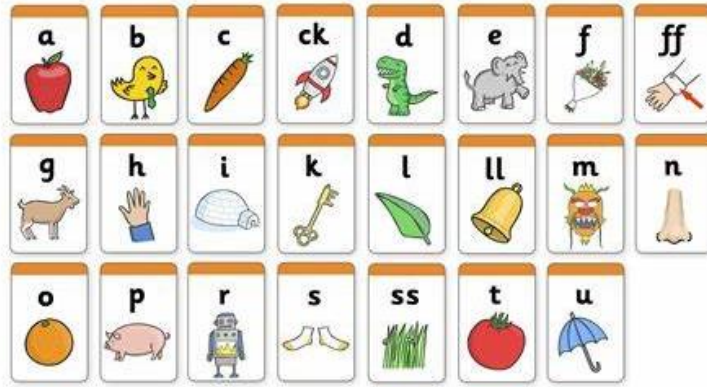
## English:- Picture Reading

In a picture reading activity for **prep** class, students are presented with colorful and engaging images. The teacher displays pictures depicting familiar scenes or objects, such as animals, toys, or daily activities. Students take turns describing what they see in the pictures, practicing vocabulary and language skills while developing comprehension and critical thinking abilities. This interactive activity encourages active participation and fosters language development in a stimulating and enjoyable way, laying the foundation for future literacy skills.



## English:- Jolly Phonic with action

In a phonics sound activity for **prep** class, students learn letter sounds through engaging and hands-on experiences. The teacher introduces each letter with a visual aid, such as a flashcard showing the letter and an associated image (e.g., "A" with an apple), and via video. Children then repeat the sound and perform a corresponding action, like pretending to bite an apple for "A." This multi-sensory approach, combining visual, auditory, and kinesthetic learning, helps students effectively associate letters with their sounds, fostering early reading skills in a fun and interactive environment.



## Pre-nursery-Visual Art:- Settling glitter bottle activity

The slow settling of the glitter can have a soothing effect, helping to calm children down when they are feeling anxious or overstimulated.

This activity provides visual and tactile sensory input, which can be particularly beneficial for sensory processing development.

Pouring, squeezing glue, and adding small items like glitter and beads help develop fine motor skills.



## Pre-nursery- Visual Art:- Smiley Fingers

Story Time:- Encourage the children to use their "smiley fingers" to create stories or have conversations. They wiggle their fingers to make the characters "talk" and interact with each other.



**MATHS NUMBER- 1** "Have the children practice recognizing and writing the number 1 by using fun materials like sand, playdough, or finger paint. Sing a simple song about the number 1, and give each child one object,

like a toy or a block, to emphasize the concept of 'one'."

listening skills, and social emotional skills.

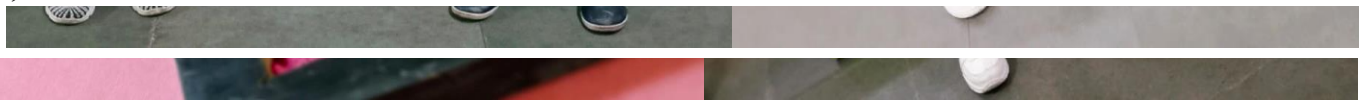


## **SPORTS ACTIVITIES**

## **FUN WITH COLOURS ACTIVITY**

Colors are a part of daily life and are all around us. The best way for children to learn them is to experience them and play with them.

The concept of colors can't be taught in one sitting and kids need lots of experiences to learn them that is why we at SDGS planned different activities for our toddlers to learn colors as Exposing children to and teaching them about the colors develops their visual perception – which is the ability of the brain to correctly interpret what the eyes see. This is an important pre-reading skill.



## Number line jump

The Number Line activity for nursery children involves placing numbers in order along a physical line, helping them understand numerical sequence and counting. Using a number line with visual aids, children can step on or point to each number, reinforcing their counting skills and number recognition. This interactive activity makes learning numbers fun and engaging, supporting early math development.



## Family Tree activity

In the Family Tree activity for nursery children, kids explore their family relationships by creating a visual representation of their family members. Using drawings or photos, they place themselves at the center and connect lines to depict their parents, siblings, grandparents, and other relatives. This hands-on activity promotes understanding of family structures, enhances vocabulary as they discuss family members, and fosters a sense of identity and belonging. It's a meaningful way for children to learn about their roots and the people who are important to them.

## Nature Walk

The Nature Walk activity for nursery children involves exploring the outdoor environment, such as a nearby park or garden, under teacher supervision. During the walk, children observe and interact with plants, trees, flowers, insects, and other elements of nature. Through hands-on exploration, they develop an appreciation for the natural world, enhance their sensory awareness, and learn about different textures, colors, and shapes. This outdoor adventure stimulates curiosity, fosters a connection with nature, and promotes physical activity and gross motor skills.





### Measuring Hand Span Activity

The Measuring Hand Span activity for prep-grade children involves using their hands to measure various objects and distances. Guided by the teacher, children compare the length of their hand spans to items like pencils, books, and tables, fostering a practical understanding of measurement and size. This hands-on approach promotes spatial awareness, fine motor skills, and mathematical concepts such as length and comparison. It's a fun and interactive way for children to explore measurement in their everyday environment.





## Number Bingo

Number Bingo is an engaging game where players match numbers on their bingo cards to numbers called out by the leader. It's a fun way to reinforce number recognition and counting skills in children. Players mark off numbers on their cards as they're called, aiming to complete a row or pattern to win.
